My name is Peter Cummings and I taught at Burren Junction for 3 years 1955-1958.I am now 83 years old but thanks to the internet I still get to see your newsletters etc. My Principal then was Col Badham who was a DFC airman in WW2. I taught K to3rd class and Col taught 4th to 6th plus correspondence



students. I lived for my first year at the Coronation Hotel which burnt down long after I left. I then boarded at the local bakery just around the corner from the PO for the remainder of my time. I taught later at Toukley, Swansea and Hamilton and left teaching for a time working as a musician and working in theatre and clubs. I finally ended up teaching High School music at Catholic High schools in Newcastle. I have fond memories of my time in Burren and hope you enjoy this letter. Thanks, from Peter.


