## 5/6S Update

# Illness Indicator and Disease Notification

Please refer to the information below about how to best judge whether or not to keep you children at home when you feel that they are unwell. There are times when children must be kept at home for a period, particularly when you suspect that they have a **notifiable disease** (see the list below). There are other times where the situation will be a "watch and act" - when in doubt, it is okay to keep your children at home to ensure that you are being responsive to their health needs, as well as curbing further spread of disease throughout the community.

#### Notifiable diseases in NSW include:

Diphtheria, Mumps, Poliomyelitis, Haemophilus influenzae Type b (Hib), Meningococcal disease, Measles, Rubella ("German measles"), Pertussis ("whooping cough"), Tetanus and COVID-19.



### Isolate from school for 24-48 hours

(as per NSW Health guidelines for outbreaks and NSW Education infectious diseases procedures)

#### For general illnesses:

- Temperature in previous 24 hours (48 hours in the event of an outbreak)
- Consistent unexplained coughing
- Congestion
- · Glassy eyed
- Requiring ongoing pain relief medication
- Vomiting and/or diarrhoea
- Lethargic and/or high emotions

#### For asthmatic students:

- Requiring asthma medication more frequently than usual
- Difficulty breathing (rapid, wheezing, retraction of neck, stomach)



### Best to stay home

#### For general illnesses:

- Low grade temperatures (under 38.0 degrees Celsius)
- Consistent coughing
- High emotions
- Tired and fatigued
- Requiring pain relief medication
- Loss of appetitie
- Generally unwell and not usual self

#### For asthmatic students:

- Coughing (slight to no wheeze) and/or shortness of breath
- Has required a nebuliser or other assistance with breathing overnight



### Ready to learn

#### For general illnesses:

- Active and well rested
- Normal appetite (unless underlying medical and/or dietary requirements)
- Clear runny nose (if nose is runny)
- No consistent cough

#### For asthmatic students:

- No wheeze, normal breathing rhythm
- No consistent cough
- On the "When well" scale of the Asthma Action Plan


